My 634. ^{AD} 5 Still Dets Attention of Road No. 60.

To the Honorable, the Commissioners of Muskegon County Ohio
We, the undersigned, appointed by the Commissioners of Muskegon
County, viewers of the alteration of Road No. 60, petitioned for by Ettil Dets and
others, respectfully

P. Dets

That, having been duly notified by the principal petition, we and Joseph
Dets appointed by your Honor as surveyor met, pursuant to Road Order
No. — made at the March Session, 1867 of the said Commission, at the
house of Martin Weston in Wayne Township, on the 14th day of March 1867;
and after taking an oath faithfully and impartially to discharge the duties
of our said appointment respectively, and taking to our assistance Jacob Rishoff
and George the Story (two suitable persons) as chain carriers, and Martin Weston
as marker, we proceeded to view, survey and lay out said alteration of Road as
proposed for in said petition, or as near the same as in our opinion, a good road
can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience,
and convenience and expense, which will result to individuals as well
as to the public, if said alteration of Road or any part thereof, shall be established
and opened; our surveyors surveying the same under our direction, and causing
it to be conspicuously marked throughout, noting the courses and distances, and
at the end of each mile causing the number of the same, and also the commencement
and termination of said road or survey, to be marked on a tree or
monument erected for that purpose. A correct return of said survey, certified
to by the surveyor, together with a plat of the same, is herewith submitted.

After due consideration, we are of opinion that said alteration ought to be established
for the following reasons, to wit: A considerable number of inhabitants requires
a road, along the route surveyed and laid out by us, the marks of travel indicate
this fact, doubtless.

And we are of opinion that the public convenience does not require the width of
said — — to be fifty feet wide and that a less width will as well promote
said convenience and we accordingly report that in our opinion, said alteration
of Road ought to be established and opened thirty feet wide from its commencement
to its termination.
