Being the north one-half of ^{section 23} seventy-six (76) acres in range eight (8), Township four (4), in said County of Coshocton and bounded on the north by lands formerly owned by Daniel McConnell and now owned by John Lake; and also by lands formerly owned by John Hunter; On the east by lands formerly owned by P. Hunter; On the west by lands of George Lash and lands formerly owned by G.
