

DAN DENNISON DESCRIPTION

Situated in the State of Ohio, County of Muskingum and Township of Hopewell and bounded and described as follows:

Being a part of the Northwest Quarter of Section 4, Township 1, Range 9, United States Military Lands and also being a part of the Alton E. and Genevieve Dennison property as described in Vol. 547, Pg 240 of the Muskingum County Deed Records and being more particularly bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point marking the intersection of the West line of Section 4 and the centerline of County Road 8 (Side Road).

Thence the following six courses along the centerline of County Road 8 (Side Road):

N. 52° 37' 10" E. 138.52 feet to a point.
N. 71° 50' 20" E. 139.25 feet to a point.
S. 80° 32' 35" E. 352.27 feet to a point.
S. 81° 21' 05" E. 291.94 feet to a point.
S. 80° 11' 15" E. 95.10 feet to a point.
N. 81° 37' 58" E. 194.99 feet to the true place of beginning of the herein described parcel.

Thence N. 79° 24' 20" E. along the centerline of County Road 8, 150.00 feet to a point on the east line of the aforementioned Dennison property.

Thence S. 0° 00' W. along the east line of the aforementioned Dennison property and passing an iron pin at 30.52 feet, a total distance of 246.22 feet to a wood post.

Thence S. 0° 53' W, 53.95 feet to an iron pin.

Thence S. 79° 24' 20" W, 149.13 feet to an iron pin.

Thence N. 0° 00' E, passing an iron pin at 259.48 feet, a total distance of 300.00 feet to the place of beginning.

Subject to all legal and existing right of ways, easements, leases, conditions and regulations of record.

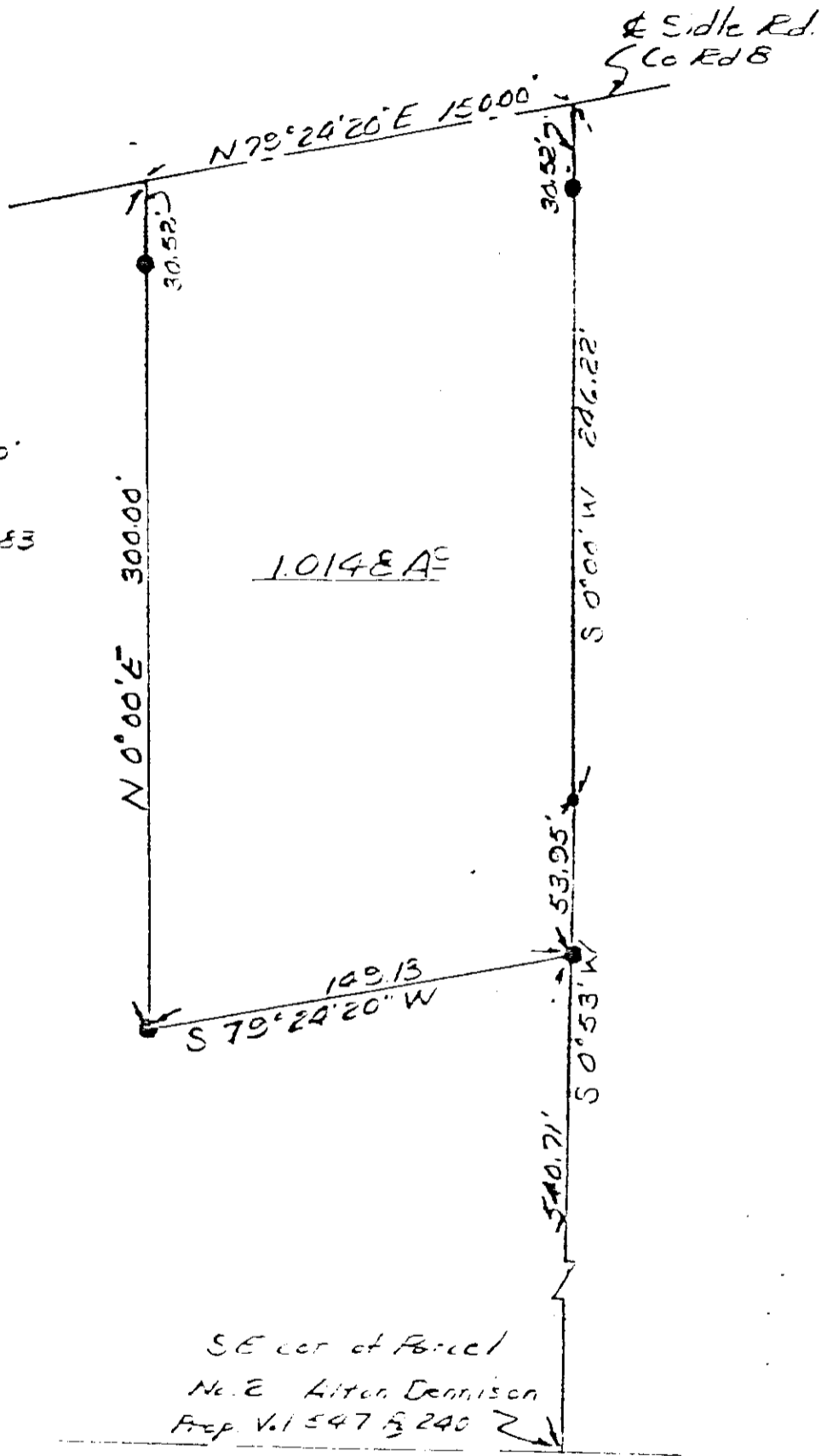
