## DESCRIPTION OF SURVEY FOR CHARLES HOCK

Being part of the Southwest and Southeast Quarters, of Section #20, Township #13, Range #12, of the Congress Lands East of the Scioto River, being part of the First Parcel on Page 190 of the Charles Hock property described in deed reference Deed Book Volume 1084, Page 187 of said county's deed records, known as Muskingum County Auditor's Parcel Number 60-40-20-35-000 and part of the Charles Hock property described in the Fourth Parcel on Page 191 deed reference Deed Book Volume 1084, Page 187 of said county's deed records, known as Muskingum County Auditor's Parcel Number 60-40-20-21-000, and more particularly described as follows;

Beginning at en iron pin (found) at the center of Section #20;

- #1- thence S 90 00 00 E 122.89 feet along the common line for the Northeast Quarter and Southeast Quarter of Section #20;
- #2- thence S 06 49 30 E 360.04 feet into said Southeast Quarter and seid Hock property to an iron pin (set), passing an iron pin (set) at 22.59 feet;
- #3- thence N 83 17 50 W 408.09 feet crossing into the Southwest Quarter of Section #20 and continuing through said Hock property to an iron pin (set);
- #4- thence N 20 19 20 W 339.57 feet continuing through said Hock property end along the West line of a 20 foot wide easement seved and excepted from the property herein described, to a peint on the common line for the Southwest and Northwest Quarters of Section #20, passing an iron pin (set) at 328.55 feet;
