Lynn (Deed Record 568-557) South 80 degrees 45 minutes 45 seconds East 29.79 feet to an iron pin set; thence continuing along said line South 80 degrees 45 minutes 45 seconds East 111.56 feet to a point on the west bank of Moxahala Creek, from which the center of a one inch bolt and nut on the southwest corner of the bridge abutment bears, North 41 degrees 26 mlnutes 00 seconds West 29.39 feet; thence along said west bank of Moxahala Creek South 06 degrees 13 minutes 47 seconds West 178.30 feet to a point on the northeast corner of lands now owned by R.
